To whom it may concern,

We really appreciate to inform you about our new program, "Global Materials Science Engineering program" for master course students. All classes are conducted in English. Its capacity is 9 students. Three (3) of them are accepted as Japanese government scholarship students, and an admission fees and two (2) years tuition are free. In addition, 144,000 JPY per month will be paid as living expenses. Those do not require repayment.

Candidate students were born after 2<sup>nd</sup> April, 1987 (younger than 34 years old), and have bachelor degree, higher or belong to Master course, now. Those students are also required:

- GPA: 2.3 or higher.
- English proficiency: B2 on CEFR or higher (TOEFL:>72, TOEIC R&L:>785, TOEIC S&W:>310), or graduation of Bachelor degree by English classes is required.

English proficiency is valid for those obtained in the last two (2) years (21 Dec, 2019 – 20 Dec 2021) by candidate students.

Could you please see attached files in details what candidate students need? We are making new webpage for our program, so, please see our faculty member in the following website. It will help to consider which research topic is interesting to student(s).

Also, Materials Science Engineering program already have a good scholarship for Ph.D. course students. Excellent students who have earned Master degree of Engineering or will be going to get it before 31 March, 2022, have opportunity to apply and receive that scholarship. Such excellent students will receive 160,000 JPY per month as living expenses, and 200,000 JPY for research. Also, there is one more good scholarship in my university level. It is 180,000 JPY per month as living expenses, and 500,000 JPY for research.

We hope that you will introduce excellent student(s) from your university to our new master course, "Global Materials Science Engineering program" in University of Toyama.
